don't worry if your child is in year 6, we will make sure you receive it.



Dear Parents and Carers,

As I sit here to write this and reflect on the last year I cannot believe how much we have all achieved and also how fast time has passed! The collaborative learning community of the five Plympton schools -Boringdon, Chaddlewood, Glen Park, Plympton St Maurice and Woodford-which make up the Plym Academy Trust have all individually and collectively achieved so much over the last year and made great plans for the future. All of this is done with the specific purpose of ensuring that all of your children receive the best possible education that they can, given our collective local resources. I am so proud of the five head teachers and their school teams as they all co-operate fully with each other to share ideas and develop their schools. As a result, the Plym Academy Trust is one of the best performing Trusts in England.

PAT Children's Council

The Plym Academy Trust Children's Council, which is represented by children from each school, met this term at Boringdon Primary School. They had an interesting tour of the school hosted by the representatives from Boringdon and shared their school's views on the best and worst things about living in Plympton and what five things they would most like to improve. We hope to have one of our local councillors come and talk to the group about their findings at the next meeting.

They were then given the challenge of going back to their schools and consulting all the classes on what the top fifty things all children of the Plym Academy Trust should do before they leave primary school! The results will be collected and collated after our next meeting and I will then publish the results in the next newsletter.

The five+ best things about living in Plympton are:

1	It's a safe place to live Friendly community
2	Facilities swimming pool, skate park, Ridgeway, Parks and library
3	Near to sea, moors and woods.
4	Lots of clubs
5	Great schools

The five worst things about living in Plympton are:

1	Traffic/road works/pollution/not enough parking
2	Anti-social behaviour - Litter/Dog mess/People smoking/graffiti in sub-
	ways
3	Destroyed habitats/green spaces when new homes are built
4	Crowds of older children make us feel scared and intimidate people
5	Other than parks, not many places to play

The five+ things we could do to improve living in Plympton are:

1	More bins/Fines for littering/Community litter pick
2	Less traffic/more places to cross the road safely/more cycle paths /fill in pot holes in roads
3	More play/sport facilities particularly indoor areas
4	Stop building so many houses
5	Regeneration of old shops/buildings. A public garden. Murals and lights in subways

Good news - Condition Improvement Fund Bids – As a multi academy one substantial advantage is we can apply annually to the Education Funding Agency (EFA) for capital funding. The core priority of this fund is to address significant condition need, keeping buildings safe and in good working order. Mrs Hook coordinated the submission of the maximum of 2 bids for each of the 5 schools to tackle their top conditions priorities. Not all bids are successful but the projects approved last and this year have brought in just over £2 million. The Bailey Partnership which completed the condition surveys of the school will project manage and coordinate tenders, through to completion of all of the projects.



Thanks to all parents, grandparents and friends who have helped in our schools over the year. I feel privileged to be the Chief Executive of the Plym Academy Trust and I am extremely grateful for every individual's contribution. A huge well done to everyone who has put so much hard work into this school year. We have been working together for a little over two years now. It has been a very successful year in all respects. In terms of SATs

it has been an excellent year for the five schools. Well done and thankyou to all the Year Six children of each school and I wish them all the very best of luck for the next chapter of their education. I believe they all have great foundations on which to build.


