Dear Parents and Carers,

The Plym Academy Trust (PAT) is a collaborative learning community comprising of five schools: Boringdon, Chaddlewood, Glen Park, Plympton St Maurice and Woodford.

The headteachers are regularly in contact with each other and meet formally every fortnight. The teachers at each school are increasingly working together and sharing best practice. We have had joint staff training on safeguarding, child protection, e-safety, managing allegations, developing outstanding teaching, reducing in school and between school variation in standards, developing a joint approach to monitoring children's progress and we are exploring ways to encourage all subject coordinators to work together.

Plym Academy Trust achievement and attainment.

The PAT is one of the highest performing multi academy trusts in the country. Our collective reading, writing and maths combined scores, individual subject scores and progress scores were all very high.

PAT Children's Council

The Plym Academy Trust Children's Council, which is represented by children from each school, met this term at Chaddlewood Primary School to give presentations about their own School Council, and to discuss what makes a great teacher and a great learner. They are now taking this task back to discuss with the children of their own schools. The results will be collated and I will publish the top ten features of a great teacher and learner in the next newsletter.

Condition Improvement Fund Bids As a multi academy, one substantial advantage is that we can now apply annually to the Education and Skills Funding Agency (ESFA) for capital funding. The core priority of this fund is to address significant condition need, keeping buildings safe and in good working order. Mrs Hook, the Trust Business Manager, coordinated the submission of the maximum of two bids for each of the five schools, to tackle their top conditions priorities last December. The PAT was given £1.2 million in July. So far, we have had new roofs at Glen Park and Chaddlewood and a new fire alarm and emergency lighting at Woodford completed. At Chadddlewood, a new classroom build is underway and new roofing is scheduled for Plympton St Maurice. Bids for next year are currently being prepared.

Good news re school funding - fingers crossed!

You may remember, I wrote to you at the end of the summer term outlining my long standing concerns regarding the funding of our schools in the Plym Academy Trust. It would appear that at long last, some of the inequality in funding that has existed for a very long time between schools in Plymouth and between schools across the country, has been addressed through the National Funding Formula. It basically states that every child, whatever their background, is entitled to a minimum amount of funding for 2018/19 of £3300, and for 2019/20 of £3500. As you might have guessed, this formula if applied by Plymouth Local Authority will bring all of our five schools up to this minimum, and bring a little more money overall to each school. In 2019/20, the rise from £3300 to £3500 for Boringdon for example, will mean an extra £200 per pupil, which equals a rise in funding of 420 pupils x £200, which is £84000. The formula in the first two years is still at the mercy of the local authority, and can be altered to something less favourable for our schools!! As from 2020/21, all local authorities will have to apply the national formula.




