Mrs Emma Bryan - Woodford

Originally from Cheltenham, I first moved down to Plymouth to study for a degree in Law. 6	Collaborates and respects others.
7	Perseveres and tries their best.
8	Believes in and has a pride in themselves.
9	Shows initiative, takes responsibility and able to work independently.
10	Learns from mistakes, take chances and challenges themselves.

The top ten qualities that helps make a great teacher in the Plym Academy Trust are:

1	Knowledgeable, enthusiastic and able to makes lessons interesting
2	Helps you when you are stuck or make mistakes – good feed back
3	An excellent questioner and explains things clearly.
4	A good listener and trustworthy
5	Well organised, uses lots of resources and sometimes teaches outside
6	Challenges you to help you to learn, believes in you.
7	Has high expectation and works hard.
8	Makes us independent, resourceful, feel safe and gives you confidence.
9	Gives lots of rewards, is kind, patient, encouraging and cares
10	Firm but fair with a sense of humour

**Good news - Condition Improvement Fund Bids** – As a multi academy one substantial advantage is we can now apply annually to the Education Funding Agency (EFA) for capital funding. The core priority of this fund is to address significant condition need, keeping buildings safe and in good working order. Last year the projects approved brought £1.2 million into the Trust. Mrs Hook has once again coordinated the submission of the maximum of 2 bids for each of the 5 schools to tackle their top conditions priorities. Fingers crossed!
